Summer Institute is a collaborative effort of the GUHSD Health Pathway Programs, Healthcare Advisory Board, Sharp Grossmont Hospital, and Kaiser Permanente. The Institute is made possible by a generous grant from Grossmont Healthcare District to support students' exposure to and preparation for careers in healthcare.



Students that complete the program receive high school credits equal to two summer school sessions.

Health-Careers Exploration Summer Institute (HESI)

Institute Goals:

- √ Increase interest in healthcare careers
- √ Improve insight into healthcare career options
- √ Expand effective communication skills

Selection Criteria:

- √ Participation in a GUHSD Health Pathway (including one year of science with human anatomy concepts, basic medical terminology, and fundamental Healthcare Essentials content)
- √ Pathway faculty recommendation
- √ Minimum 2.5 GPA and satisfactory or higher conduct grades for the previous two semesters
- √ Able to participate the full four weeks for eight hours daily (M-F)
- √ Application packet submitted on or before due date
- √ Mandatory student orientation
- √ Parent orientation and agreement to requirements

The Institute consists of classroom instruction, job shadowing observations, and limited (no patient care) hands-on experiences. For the past three years, job shadowing has been provided at Kaiser Permanente and Sharp Grossmont Hospitals.



The program addresses the five major career clusters as recognized by the National Consortium on Health Science and Technology Education and the California Department of Education (reflected in logo).



At the conclusion of the Institute, students formally present their experiences as case studies to family, educators, and hospital staff.
